

When to get vaccinated against whooping cough (pertussis)?

Between 2 months and 6 years old

My child gets **4 doses**, according to **the immunization schedule**.

2 months ✓ 4 months ✓ 12 months ✓ 4-6 years ✓



During each pregnancy

I get vaccinated at 26 weeks or after (1 dose).

If my vaccines are not up to date

I get vaccinated, according to the recommendations.



Are your vaccines up to date?

If you have a specific medical condition or any questions, talk with a healthcare professional.

! Getting whooping cough does not replace vaccination. You still need to get the same number of doses.

| Age | To be well protected against whooping cough, it is important to receive |
|-------------------------|---|
| Between 4 and 11 months | 2 doses of the vaccine or more |
| Between 1 and 3 years | 3 doses of the vaccine or more Note: With at least 1 dose received at 1 year old or after |
| Between 4 and 17 years | 3 doses of the vaccine or more Note: With at least 1 dose received at 4 years old or after |
| 18 years and over | 1 dose of the vaccine or more |
